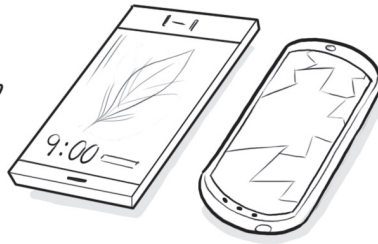

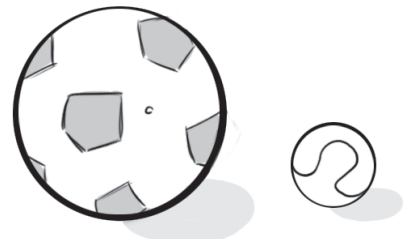

- Dad (catch) a big fish yesterday. We (just eat) it.
- My brother is in South Africa. He (not write) to us for more than a month. We (get) his latest letter five weeks ago.
- Arnold Schwarzenegger (leave) Austria when he (be) 21. He (make) more than 15 films since then.

- (you ever be) to the USA? – No, but my family and I (go) to Canada last year.

- (you ever be) to Monaco for the Grand Prix? – Yes, once. Dad and I (drive) there last year and we (enjoy) it very much.
